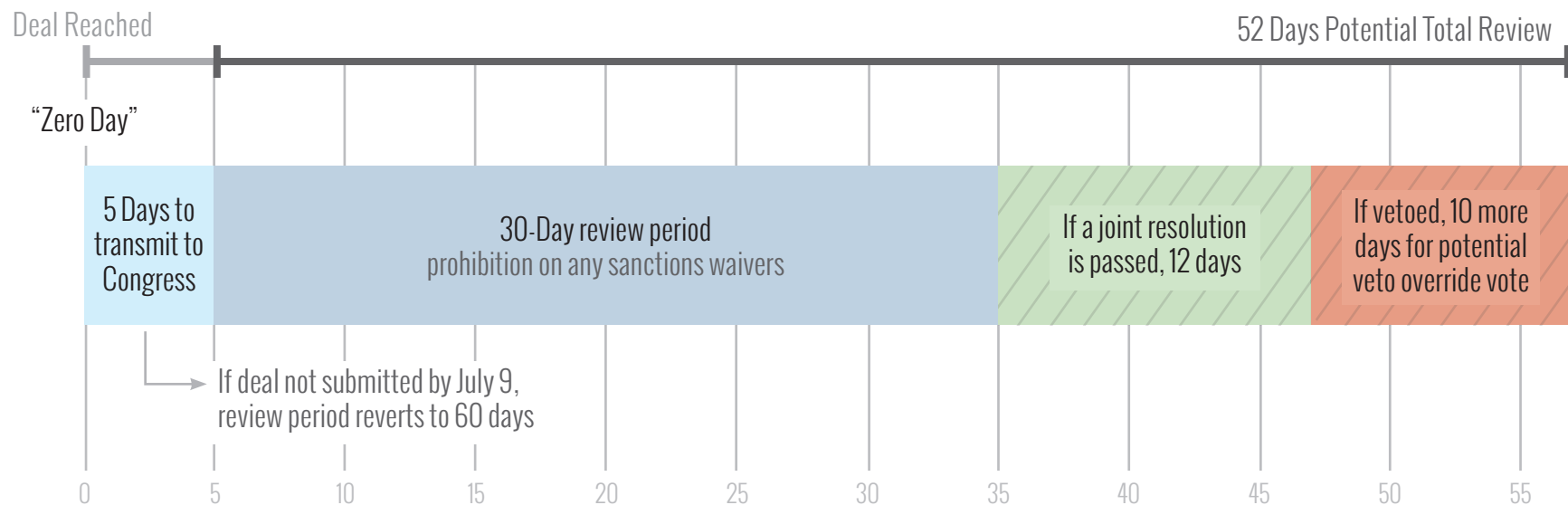


PROPOSED LEGISLATIVE TIMELINE AFTER AN IRAN DEAL (JCPOA)

After the interim deal to place limits on Iran’s nuclear program was announced—the so-called Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action, or JCPOA—the Senate Foreign Relations Committee approved a modified version of S. 615 (The Iran Nuclear Agreement Review Act of 2015). The bill establishes a period of Congressional review after a final deal, contemplates a Congressional vote of approval or disapproval at the conclusion of that period, and institutes a number of reporting requirements. During the review period, the bill prohibits the President from offering any additional sanctions relief to Iran. The timeline below depicts the review process in stages.



Reporting Requirements:

- **Verification Assessment Evaluating:** U.S. ability to verify Iranian compliance, International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) ability to implement verification regime.
- **Compliance Reports:** After deal, reports required every 90 days on implementation of agreement and Iranian compliance.
- **Certification Requirement:** President must certify that agreement includes appropriate conditions on Iran’s nuclear program, describes specific sanctions to be waived and meets U.S. non-proliferation objectives.
